Prior to joining the faculty at Utah Tech University, I prosecuted criminal cases in adult and juvenile courts in northern Utah. I served as chief of the special victim's division at the Davis County Attorney's office and specialized in prosecuting domestic violence, sexual assault, and child abuse cases. During my career as a prosecutor, I tried numerous serious felony cases involving a variety of offenses including aggravated murder. I was the lead prosecutor in State v. Raymond Butterfield, a case that led the way for the admissibility of PCR-STR DNA evidence in Utah courts. I am a recipient of the Thomas Reuters, Everyday Heroes Award for my work on the prosecution team in State v. Nathan Ward. I served as an instructor of a sexual assault investigations course at POST where I had the opportunity to teach law enforcement officers from across the state. I also worked as investigative counsel for the Utah Judicial Conduct Commission where I investigated complaints against Utah judges and prosecuted disciplinary proceedings when warranted. In 2020, I was appointed by the Governor to the Second District Judicial Nominating Commission. I earned a BA degree from the University of Utah in linguistics
